#### A Message from Principal Brown

### **Computers/Supplies**

## From the Nurse

The Winters Mill High School Health Suite will be open on August 29 (9am – 2pm), August 30 (10:30am – 2pm), September 1 (9am-2pm and 5:30pm – 7:30pm), and September 2 (9am-2pm) to receive medications and medication orders for students attending Winters Mill High School this fall.

Medication forms expire at the end of the school year and need to be completed again for each year. Medication forms can be found in the Health Suite. Main Office. or on the WMH website. Over the counter medication must be brought to school in an original, unopened container labeled for the intended student. Inhalers and epinephrine can be carried by student if a medication form is signed by a doctor and a parent, and then brought to the Health Suite. Ibuprofen and Tylenol (acetaminophen) can be administered by the nurse after a medication form is signed by a parent or guardian. All other medication, whether prescription or nonprescription, needs to have a doctor's (MD, NP, or PA) signature.

The following items are not considered to be medications and students can carry: Chap Stick/ lip balm, non-medicated cough drops, saline and rewetting drops for contacts, saline nose spray, hand cream or lotion, sunscreen, waterless hand cleanser, salt tablets, and Glucose tablets.

### **Schoology**

Teachers will continue to use Schoology to post assignments and materials necessary for class. Students can access Schoology through Clever or at <u>https://carrollk12.schoology.com</u>

Parents can access their student's Schoology page. CCPS sends out access codes to parent emails for each of their students. Directions for setting up the account are <u>here</u>. ### Parent/Guardian Contact Information

All students will receive an Emergency Card from their advisor on the first day of school. Parents should review the emergency card and make any necessary updates. The email address and phone numbers provided on the emergency card are used to communicate with you! If your address changes throughout the school year, please notify the school. You will need to provide documentation to verify a new mailing address. All students are required to return an updated emergency card to the school by September 19th.

## **Arrival and Departure**

Students who walk or ride the bus to school should enter through the main entrance or through the student entrance (student parking lot). Students who drive to school should park in the student lot and enter through the student entrance. Parents dropping students off to school should pull forward to the first cone and follow the instructions of the school staff in the parking lot. Doors open at 7am. Students may not use the staff entrance (stadium side). **Please see the attachment for details!** 

Students are dismissed from school at 2:20. Students not under supervision of a staff member will need to leave the building by 2:50PM. Students riding the bus will exit to the front of the building. Students being picked up or driving should exit through the student entrance and abide by instructions of the staff working in the student parking lot.

## Parking Permits


All student drivers must have a valid 2022-2023 parking permit. The Winters Mill Parking Permit can now be requested and paid for on-line using MySchoolBucks. Permits cost \$20 per year and are only valid for parking at Winters Mill HS. The parking application must be completed in full and registration fee paid on-line. Once completed, please bring your driver's license and vehicle registration to the Main Office to pick-up your permit.

For students driving to school at the beginning of the school year: This form is due back to the main office by **September 20, 2022**. Tickets and fines may be issued after this date.

### Food and Beverages


Breakfast and lunch shall be consumed in the cafeteria. However, students are permitted to have a water bottle with them in the classroom. *Deliveries to Students During the School Day:* Deliveries from outside food vendors are not permitted during the school day. Parents/guardians who have an item to drop off to their student should leave the item on the table outside the Main Entrance. We are unable to deliver or call students for items that are dropped off during the school day. We are not responsible for items left unattended on the table.

### WINTERS MILL HIGH SCHOOL HOURS

WMH doors open for students at 7:00 am. Class hours are 7:30 am - 2:20 pm. The first bell rings at 7:15 am, allowing students to go to their lockers and classrooms. A five-minute warning bell rings at 7:25 am. The final bell rings at 7:30 am, when students should be in their classroom ready to begin. Students not in their classrooms by the 7:30 bell are considered late to school. An after school detention will be issued for the third unexcused. After the fourth lateness to school, the student will be issued an after school detention and parent/student conference will be scheduled. Additional consequences such as Saturday School may be assigned after the 4<sup>th</sup> lateness to school.

After the 2:20 pm dismissal bell, students are expected to leave school grounds by 2:50 pm, unless under the direct supervision of faculty, staff or coaches.

## Important Message from our Counselors

Greetings from the Winters Mill High School Counseling Department. We hope everyone had a restful summer!

As the school year begins, we ask that you review the reasons listed below regarding requesting a schedule correction. Students should only request an appointment if the requested change meets one of the criteria. Students and parents signed off on course requests in February and our master schedule is created using those course requests. Therefore, schedule adjustments for other reasons than those listed below aren't possible at this time.

#### **Reasons for Schedule Correction:**

- Hole in schedule/Please See Counselor
- Course scheduled has already been passed
- Senior is missing a graduation requirement
- Course is scheduled but prerequisite hasn't been met
- Need to reschedule a failed graduation requirement course
- Course is out of sequence (For example, Spanish 2, before Spanish 1)

If your student requires a schedule correction for one of these reasons, please have them obtain a form from the counseling office or from their advisor.

If your student is requesting to drop an Advanced Placement course, they must obtain approval from Mr. Brown who will then email the counselor.

If your student wants to make an appointment with a counselor, please visit the school counseling office and speak with Ms. Hobson.

### **Code of Academic Honesty**

Academic honesty is an essential part of any school community. Winters Mill High School seeks to promote the importance of honesty as a basis of respect and cooperation among all students, teachers, staff, and administrators. Students must be aware of the following definitions, expectations and policies that make up the Code of Academic Honesty at Winters Mill High School.

Unless the assignment itself is designed to be a cooperative task or unless the teacher identifies specific conditions, the following acts and behaviors are examples of academic dishonesty:

- Plagiarism- using another person's work or ideas as your own (classmates, websites etc.) or other resources in a copy/paste fashion.
- Stealing a test or answer key.
- Using or making notes or "cheat sheets" during a test or quiz.
- Looking at another student's paper or computer while a test/quiz is in progress.
- Copying any work from another student, whether it be a formative or summative assignment or assessment.
- Copying work from an internet source verbatim and not citing appropriately.
- Talking during a test.
- Using an electronic device during an assessment to access notes, internet or another student. Often, any electronic device use during an assessment is considered cheating as teachers cannot verify for what the device is being used.
- Other forms of cheating determined as by a teacher.

The discipline for academic dishonesty may include (Violations are cumulative for the course):

- 1st offense: Zero on the initial assignment/assessment with an opportunity to redo the assignment/assessment or a similar one for reduced credit, referral into the discipline system and parent contact.
- 2nd offense: Zero on assignment, referral into the discipline system and parent/teacher/administrator conference.
- 3<sup>rd</sup> offense: Zero on assignment, referral into the discipline system, parent/teacher/administrator conference and grade of "F" for the marking period.

Children who see a dentist regularly may have fewer health issues like:

Vaccines Offered at Carroll County Back-to-School Clinics

The clinics are for children ages 4-18. Please contact your medical provider, school nurse or CCHD to see if you are missing vaccinations.

You must accompany your child to this clinic. The vaccinations will be given, regardless of your insurance, at **no cost to you. You will NOT be charged a deductible or copay**.

Please DO NOT come to the clinic if you or your child has had a fever in the past day, felt sick, or been around someone who is sick. You and your child will need to wear a mask while at the clinic.

#### **CONSENT AND RELEASE**

#### Permission to Photograph, Videotape or Audiotape

Throughout the school year, the Carroll County Public School System frequently covers school activities and may use your child's photograph, video image, or voice for educational, informational, or public relations purposes, with or without identification by name.

If you do not wish to have your child's voice reproduced on tape or to have his/her image appear in such things as a video or a photograph, or on the school or school system website or social media, please notify the school principal in writing. It is assumed that parents and guardians consent to their children being audiotaped, photographed, videotaped, or having their image placed on a school website or social media by the school system unless such notification is received.

There are also occasions when the media cover certain school events (such as when a government leader visits a school). If you do not wish to have your child's name or likeness published by the media, you should address your concerns directly to the school involved so that the media is so advised. Please be advised that the school system has no control over the media when they are covering activities such as sporting events and musical programs that are open to the public.

#### Use of Student Work on Websites or in Publications

There may be times throughout the year when the Carroll County Public School System wishes to display student work on school websites, social media, or in publications. If you do not wish to have your child's art, poetry, writing, etc. appear on school websites, social media, or in publications, please notify the school principal in writing. It is assumed that parents and guardians consent to their child's work being displayed on school websites, social media, or in publications is received.

#### Parent Permissions

Every year parents are given the opportunity to opt their students in/out of certain information sharing processes and data collection initiatives. Parents are able to give, or not give, permission for the following items:

- · Permission to Release Information to Military Recruiters (Default is Give Permission)
- · Permission to Release Information to Higher Ed (Default is Give Permission)
- · Consent for Student Participation in the Youth Risk Behavior Survey (Default is Give Permission)
- Ability to opt out of receiving secure (encrypted) emails\*. (Default is RECEIVE Secure Email-click box to OPT out)

The primary guardian will receive an email in August with a link to the Parent Permission form. Paper copies of the Parent Permission form are also available in the WM main office. If parents/guardians want to make a change after completing the online form, they must complete the paper form.
